Consumer Information

The law requires manufacturers offering to sell new computer equipment in or into Texas to provide a program for collecting and recycling of consumers' used computer equipment.



Since Sept. 1, 2008, manufacturers have had to provide a program. Each manufacturer is responsible only for its own brand (s) of computer equipment. The collection and recycling must be convenient and free at the time of recycling. The rules define computer equipment as:

- a monitor.
- a desktop computer or laptop, and
- an accompanying keyboard and mouse made by the same manufacturer.

The manufacturers are required to offer collection and recycling only for computer equipment purchased primarily for personal or home-business use—regardless of when it was sold; that is, not just computer equipment purchased after Sept. 1, 2008.

By law, you will be responsible for any confidential information left on the computer equipment.

- Phone books
- Office & school paper
- Glass containers and dishes
- Chipboard & boxboard (empty cereal boxes, soda boxes, cardboard)
- Newspapers
- Empty Aerosol Cans
- Magazines, catalogs and junk Mail
- Paper Grocery Bags
- Plastic Bottles (#1–2 Remove and discard lids)
- Steel and Tin Cans
- Aluminum cans

Bulk Trash Collection -

Bulk Trash curbside collection is the third Thursday each month. Items included in the bulk collection are as follows:

Bulky Trash – stoves, refrigerators, water tanks, washing machines, furniture, construction debris (generated by primary residential unit only) and other waste materials. Customer shall be responsible for the removal of refrigerants and other hazardous wastes from bulk pick-up items, and shall properly tag bulky waste items as being free of refrigeration, and other hazardous wastes, prior to removal by Contractor.

Bundle - Tree, shrub and brush trimmings do not require bundling but should not exceed 6' in length. Newspapers and magazines should be securely tied together forming an easily handled package not exceeding fifty (50) lbs. in weight.
